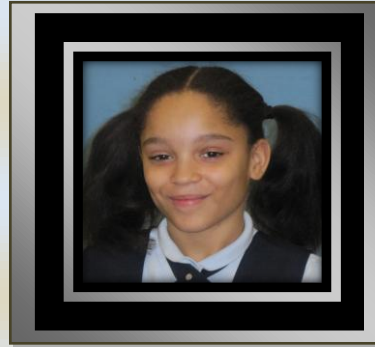
CSEE Student Council Oath

Raheem Roberts is the Vice President of Class 5-110. Raheem has been in attendance at CSEE since September 2010. His favorite subject is Science.



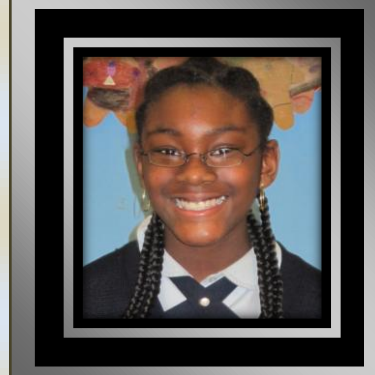

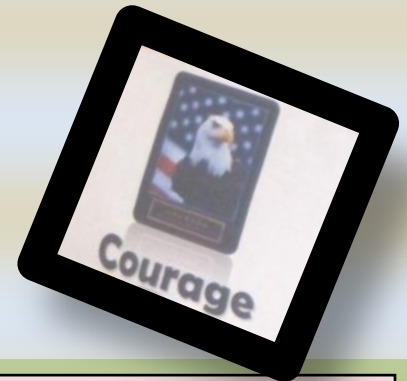

At the Charter School of Educational Excellence, our patterns of thought and behavior are based on high moral standards. Each of the 7 leadership virtues at CSEE has a core value that contributes to our traditional system of beliefs, ideas, and opinions. Our society embraces and share these leadership virtues among many within our culture; the CSEE culture.*



***Humility** is the quality of being modest and politely submissive. When leading with humility, you accept the position given to you by your peers and teachers, and use it on behalf of others.*



***Integrity** is a vital quality in leadership. It's about consistency of character, values, principles, and expectations. This virtue is regarded as the quality of having an intuitive sense of honesty and truthfulness in regards to one's actions. Of all the virtues, integrity is the one that is respected the most, but the least often displayed. Good leaders do not alter their character or their integrity.*



***Courage** is not about the absence of fear; it is about ability to act rightly in the face of popular opposition, shame, or discouragement. It's about caring enough about your values and up-holding them in the face of personal rift despite the consequences.*



***Compassionate** leaders think through the consequences of their actions, they're generous, and accept the weakness of others. Compassionate leaders do not turn a blind eye to others hurting; they intervene to try to make things better.*



***Passionate** leaders put their hearts, souls, and spirits into producing extraordinary results. They motivate and inspire others, and provide the purpose that drives and helps others to overcome obstacles and setbacks.*



*A leader with **humor** produces laughter around them. They put things into perspective when others feel stressed or angry in order to calm them down. A leader with humor knows the right thing to say to diffuse a situation, and do not take themselves too seriously.*



***Wisdom** is the ability to effectively and efficiently apply perceptions and knowledge and produce the desired results. Wisdom is the comprehension of what is true or right coupled with optimum judgment. Wisdom often requires control of one's emotional reaction so that one's principles, reasons and knowledge prevail to determine one's action. Use your experiences to improve things around you.*
